

SPOKEFEST BICYCLE EDUCATION AND SAFETY GRANT

In 2010 SpokeFest established a grant fund to support bicycle educational and safety programs in the community

2010 -- SF purchased 30 bikes and provided teacher training for the 4th through 6th grade physical education program for the **East Valley School District** (\$7,000)

2011 – SF provided a grant to the **East Kiwanis** bicycle helmet giveaway for children in the area (\$4,000)

2012 – SF purchased 30 bikes and helmets for the **Central Valley School District's** 4th and 5th grade bicycle education program to benefit 13 elementary schools (\$6,100)

2013 – SF provided a grant to **Pedals2People** “Be Seen Be Safe” program that provided bicycle lights and helmets for children in low income neighborhoods in Spokane (\$2,300)

2014 – Grant was not used and refunded

2015 – SF provided a grant to the **Community of Montessori Parents for the Spokane Public Montessori School** to fund a bicycle laboratory at the school (\$1,500)

2016 – Two organizations were given grants – **Cup of Cool Water** – homeless youth are given the opportunity to earn a bike by working in the bike shop – (\$1,900)

Tesh, Inc. – Coeur d’Alene, ID – Camp Independence program serving children and young adults ages 5 – 21 with developmental and physical disabilities, grant was used to purchase two Mobo Mobito Three Wheeled Cruisers for use during the camp – (\$600)

2017 – The grant was deferred to 2018

2018/19 – The Friends of the Centennial Trail – Upgrades were made to the Centennial Trail that include repainting bollards and wavy lines on either side, repairing yellow lines on blind corners, and replacing Centennial Trail logo and safety signs (arrows, Keep Right, Pass with Care, 15 mph, etc. (\$5,000)

\$28,400 in grants have been given since 2010
